College entrepreneurship center in final funds pitch

Golden West College and the nonprofit Oak View Renewal Partnership in Huntington Beach are in the final fundraising stage for a new Center for Entrepreneurship & Leadership at the campus.

Nearly \$350,000 has been raised with an overall goal of \$500,000 to launch the center, which will focus on skill-based business education with fields that include catering, cosmetology and other lifestyle businesses. If the fundraising goal is reached before the end of June, the center should debut by the fall. Golden West College President Wes

Golden West College President We Bryan said the center would be a good fit for students, who often graduate or complete certificate programs with marketable skills but sometimes lack entrepreneurial know-how.

The center, which will be located in the old library building, will also offer support for digital media, programing or consulting businesses.

OVRP first worked with Golden West 18 years ago with El Viento, an organization that serves local children and young adults through ocean-based activities. The nonprofit came back to the college in 2013 to present the idea of having an on-campus support and education center for students who would like to learn what goes into starting up a business.

Major contributors so far include Wells Fargo and the Linda & Tod White Charitable Fund, which both donated \$100,000.

Once completed, the program is projected to produce more than \$55 million in economic activity over the first three years, according to economist Wallace Walrod.

Walrod's economic impact study estimated that within the first three years of the center's opening, 130 new businesses would start up along with 1,400 new jobs in the county and a minimum of \$4.3 million in combined tax revenue increases.

OVRP has been working with Golden West on the center since mid-2013. Bryan said the school has already modified its curriculum this year to include entrepreneurship education. Classes and workshops will take place in the center once it opens.
